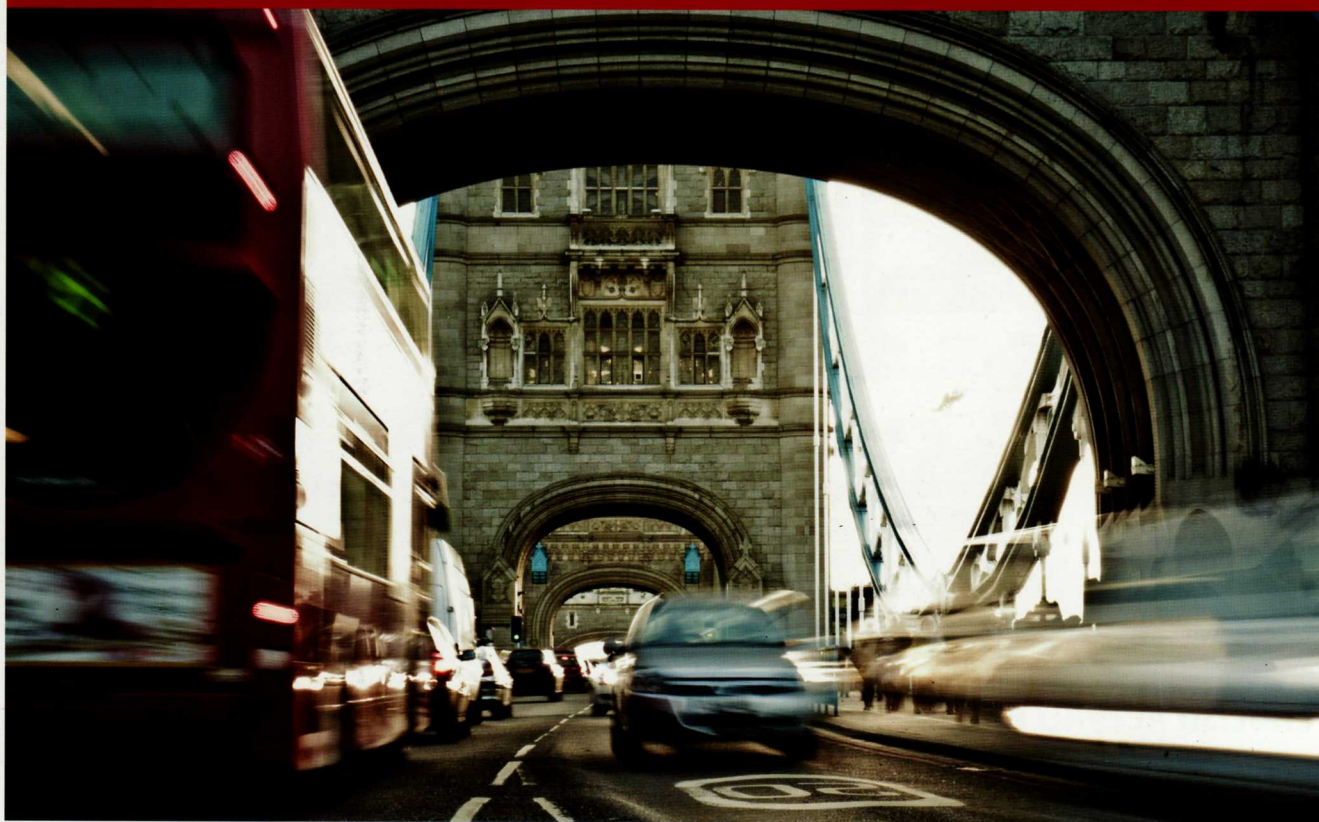

Jeannette Law is an American based in Milan. **She runs an educational consultancy¹** called SAGE Advising, SAGE being an acronym of Smart Adventures in Global Education. The first thing I would say is, you want to start the

process as early as you can. Most students will start in the penultimate year of *liceo*, if not before. There are lots of tests that you have to take, you have to prepare for them, so the more time you have, **the better⁵**.

I would also encourage students to consider all 50 states. There are 50 states in the US and not everyone should go to New York City. There are many great universities all around the country and very often students that apply to universities outside of the most popular cities and most popular areas may get **scholarships⁶**, and the universities will be attracted to the students for **diversity purposes⁷**.
